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2026 SMART FIRES Professional Development Grants

For Early Career Faculty and Trainees

Deadline: September 29, 2026

The NSF EPSCoR RII Track-1 SMART FIRES project will support early career faculty and trainees at The University of Montana to pursue professional development activities through the 2026-27 academic year. The purpose of this program is to support early-career faculty and postdoctoral scholars in disciplines related to the SMART FIRES project.

Who is eligible

Tenure-track faculty at the assistant level, NTT faculty, and postdoctoral scholars in disciplines related to the SMART FIRES project; these disciplines include (but are not limited to) computer science, economics, chemistry & biochemistry, social science, and all disciplines within the W.A. Franke College of Forestry and Conservation.

What is supported (how these funds can be spent)

These grants can support professional development activities that include (but are not limited to) domestic travel to conferences, travel and tuition/registration fees for professional development courses and skills development, working with external mentors, and building professional networks.

Award amount

Up to \$5,000 (direct funds)

Award notification	Tuesday, October 6, 2026
Funds must be fully spent by	June 30, 2027

Email a proposal of **500 words or less** as a PDF to SMART FIRES Project Administrator Erika Hildner (erika.hildner@mso.umt.edu) **by Friday, September 29, 2026**. Your proposal must include:

- A description of the proposed activities
- An explanation of how the activities support your professional development
- An itemized budget with justification
- Confirmation that all funds will be spent by June 30, 2027
